HOW TO ACCESS LIBRARY DATABASES

Where you can get access to databases

- **In the Library** you can access **Imperial and NHS Athens resources** with your Imperial College London login (please speak to library staff to apply for a login)
- **From home or work** via NHS Evidence www.evidence.nhs.uk for NHS Athens resources only

Different passwords and when to use them – resources listed are **open access except where stated**

- **NHS Athens** username and password: all NHS staff in London trusts are eligible to register for an NHS Athens login. Speak to library staff for further details. These resources are accessible to you both in the Library and at home
- **Imperial College London resources:** most databases and journals are accessible with no password on campus, but some also require one. Please speak to library staff if you are asked for a password

DATABASES

AMED (Allied and Alternative Medicine)	Abstracts and bibliographic citations from journals relating to complementary medicine, palliative care and allied health professions – NHS/Imperial
BNI (British Nursing Index)	Searches over 250 journal sources in nursing and midwifery fields – NHS
CINAHL	Covers all aspects of nursing and allied health disciplines – NHS
Cochrane Library	Collection of evidence-based medicine databases offering full-text systematic reviews, clinical trials and more – open access in the UK, NHS Athens overseas
Embase	Abstracts from international biomedical and pharmaceutical journals – NHS/Imperial
IBSS (International Bibliography of Social Sciences)	Abstracts in social sciences – Imperial
King's Fund (Health Management Information Consortium)	Focuses on improving health care, covering management and policy – NHS/Imperial
Medline	General and comprehensive international database of biomedical articles including nursing and midwifery – NHS/Imperial
Maternity and Infant Care	Specialist midwifery database – Imperial
PubMed	General and comprehensive international database of biomedical articles including nursing and midwifery – open access alternative Medline interface
PsycINFO	Abstracts and citations in the field of psychology and related disciplines, such as nursing, sociology, education, business and law – NHS/Imperial
Social Care Online	www.scie-socialcareonline.org.uk – database of abstracts and full-text research briefings, links, articles, reports and government documents
Web of Science	A collection of multidisciplinary databases searching journals, conference proceedings and journal/author citations – Imperial

NHS Evidence	www.evidence.nhs.uk – the NHS’s online portal of resources, including databases, guidelines, links, ejournals and current awareness tools
RCN (Royal College of Nursing)	www.rcn.org.uk – guidelines, resources and careers advice with a UK focus. Some material requires membership but much is free

CURRENT AWARENESS BULLETINS

LondonLinks	www.londonlinks.ac.uk/current_awarenes – The online portal of the London Deanery’s library service, provides access to a number of current awareness bulletins by various NHS and other organisations
National Library for Health RSS feeds	Log into NHS Evidence to set up RSS feeds from useful websites to create a single personalised site for your updates

When you have found references for useful articles via these databases, you will then need to locate the journals they are published in. If there is no direct link to the full text you can search **NHS Athens** Resources through **NHS Evidence** (log in and choose ‘My Journals’ from the homepage of Health Information Resources) and the **Imperial College London Library** catalogue (www.imperial.ac.uk/library), which will show you the availability both in print and electronic formats (e-access is only available in the library).
