Imperial College London is piloting Echo360, a lecture capture system, in the Business School and Faculty of Medicine (MSc Allergy) for automatically recording (capturing) lectures.

What does Echo360 record?

The Echo360 system is capable of recording audio, video and any output from the computer (including slides) and other devices connected to the projector such as visualisers. When integrated with an interactive whiteboard or tablet PC, the system can also capture annotations.

How are the recorded lectures delivered?

The files are stored on a media streaming server and are available in four formats (Rich Media, Vodcast, Enhanced Podcast and Podcast). They can be delivered to students in a number of ways, including via RSS feeds and Blackboard.

Why should I consider recording my lectures?

Recording lectures can be beneficial to both staff and students. For students, they are able to catch up on lectures they might have missed or they can watch a lecture again to aid understanding of difficult concepts, as a revision aid or to provide extra back up for notes they have taken. For staff, it can provide a means to record a lecture that might otherwise have to be rescheduled as well as the opportunity to review their own lectures.

What else could the system be used for?

As well as recording course lectures, it could also be used for recording student presentations, conferences, guest lectures and online training videos.

How can I start recording my lectures using Echo360?

The equipment would typically be installed into a lecture theatre, but could also be used as a mobile facility which can be temporarily set up in various rooms.
