Feedback from peer

1. Are the experiences discussed clearly linked to the attribute?

No. The chosen attribute is discovery mindset and this piece talks about being curiosity driven.

2. Is the submission more reflective (focused on own development) than descriptive (listing achievements)?

No. The final paragraph describes how the writer has changed because of this experience but it is not clear how they have developed. There is not enough detail of why and how they changed their mindset. For example, the first paragraph is very generic and broad which makes it hard as a reader to see what impacted them the most. How was your life enriched? What was the profound impact nursing your nephew had? You mention that reading has extended your curiosity but how and what have you learnt from this?

3. Does the submission discuss changes in thinking and behaviour as a result of experiences?

Yes. This submission describes well how the writer's way of thinking has changed however some of the connections between the experience and what they have learnt is hard to see. For example, it is mentioned that the new mindset has spilled over into other areas however there is no detail in how this change of mindset has impacted these areas.

4. Does the submission reflect on the changes in thinking and behaviour as a result of experiences?

This is hard to comment on as the specific changes in behaviour and thinking are difficult to identify. There aren't enough actual examples within the piece to say for certain.

Please list strengths of the piece

This submission's topic of supporting their nephew is very impactful.

5. Please provide any advice that would be useful to the Participant, e.g. where more reflection could be added

More reflection could be added throughout. For example, paragraph two could focus less on describing how the knowledge was acquired and give more details on how the pursuit of knowledge has changed the way the writer acts or learns. It could be easier to understand if the writer narrows some of their statements, for example where they talk about the impact a change of mindset has had. The language used is generally quite vague which does make it difficult to link exactly what behaviours and experiences impacted the changes of thinking. It's also difficult to understand what the writer has changed.
