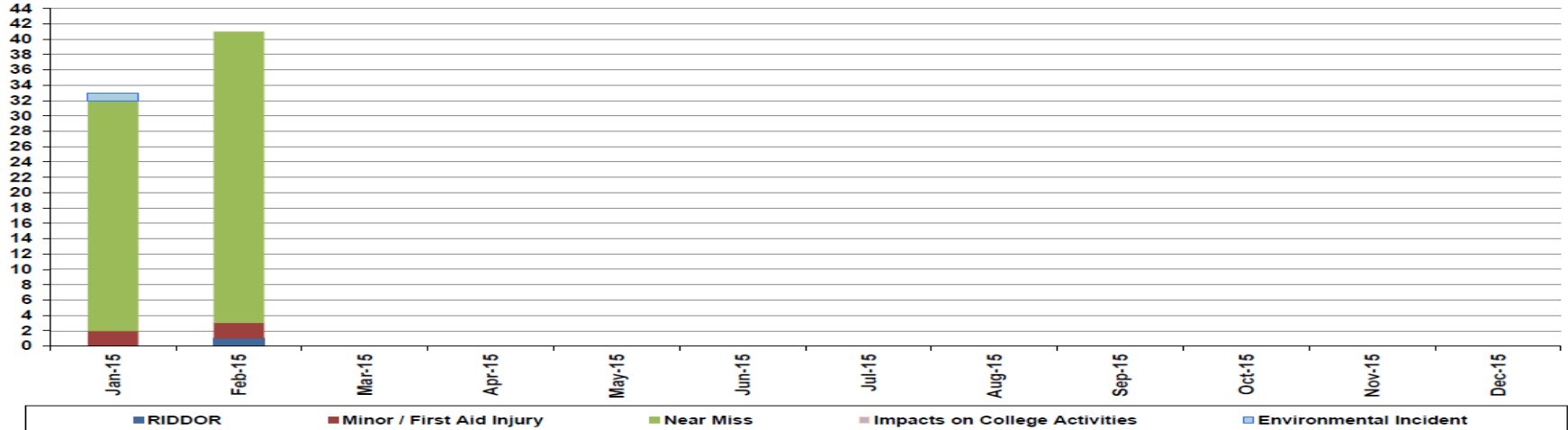

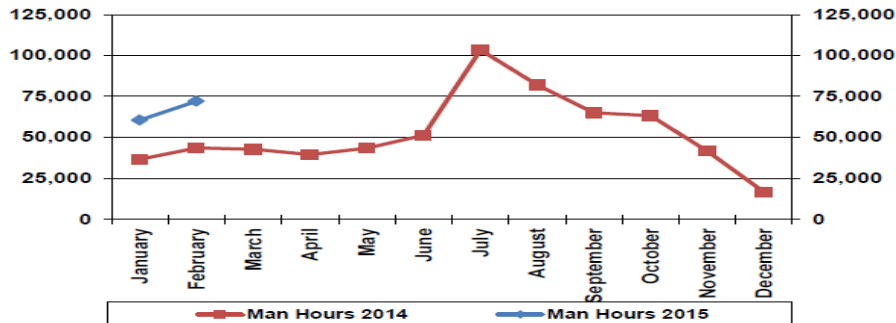

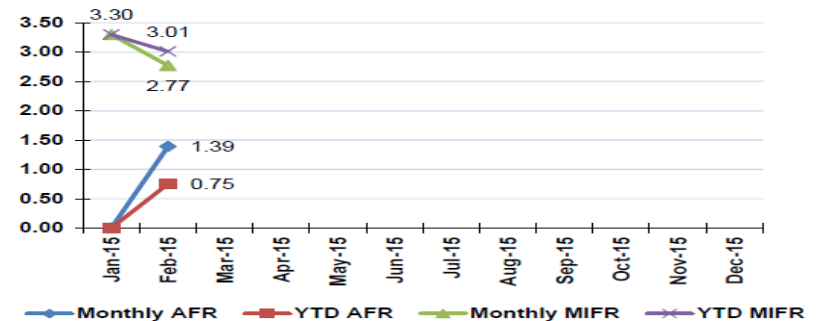
ACCIDENTS, NEAR MISSES, COLLEGE IMPACTS & ENVIRONMENTAL INCIDENTS - 2015

Contractor's Monthly Statistics – February 2015

- 9 no. inspections completed during February 2015 (5 GREEN and 4 AMBER).
- 72,114 hours were worked on the projects during the month.
- The AFR for 2015 is currently 0.75. The last RIDDOR reportable accident occurred on 25th February 2015. (25/02 – Imperial West RIDDOR injury – Richard Byrne (LOR) will provide further information during lessons learnt.)
- The MIFR for 2015 is 3.01. 2 no. minor accidents reported for February (4 no. to date in 2015).
- A total of 38 near misses were recorded during the month of February. Housekeeping and access issues were the main concerns raised from the near misses reported by the contractors.

- 42 construction workers were fatally injured in 2013/2014 compared to 39 in 2012/2013. This makes construction the worst industry in the UK for worker fatalities.
- An estimated 2.3 million working days were lost in 2013/14, 1.7 million due to ill health and 592,000 due to workplace injury, making a total of 1.1 days lost per worker (LFS).
- Injuries and new cases of ill health resulting largely from current working conditions in workers in construction cost society over £1.1 billion a year.

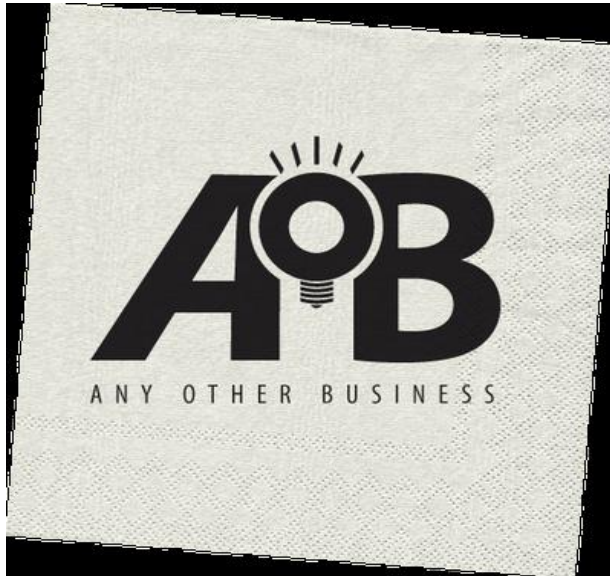
