


RefWorks: importing references from OnePetro

With some online resources you cannot export references directly into RefWorks. Instead you must save the references in a text file and then import it into RefWorks.

- Conduct your search and tick the boxes next to the references you wish to export

2. Click **Browse** to locate your saved file

3. Click **Import** to extract your saved references

- For **Database** select **RIS Format**
- Click **Browse** and locate your saved file
- Click on **Import**
- Your saved references will be imported into RefWorks
