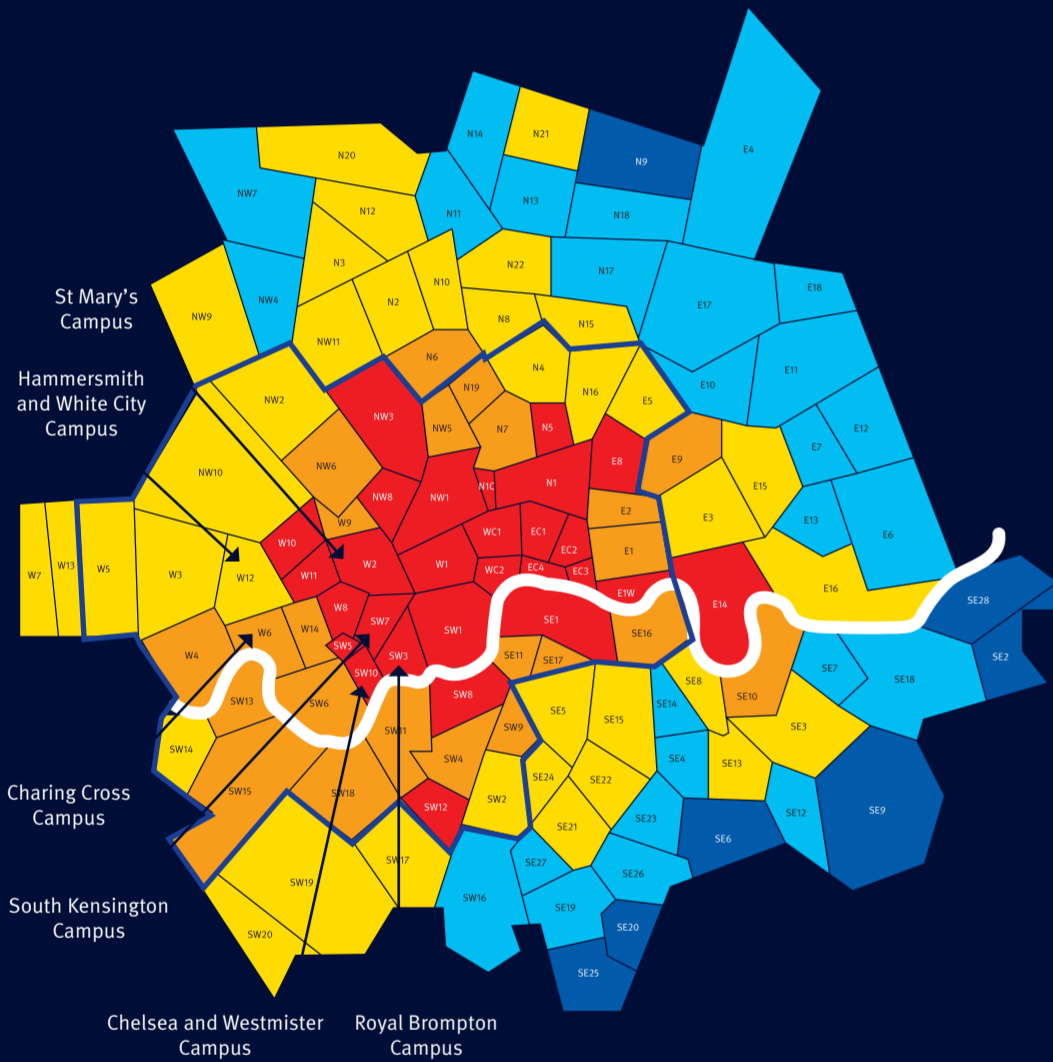
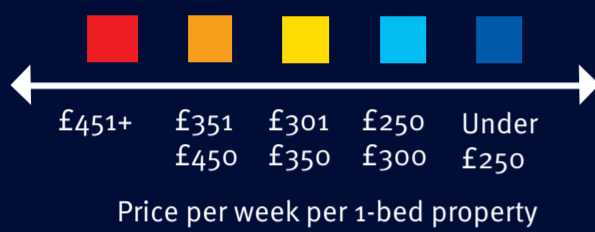
## Which area is best for you?

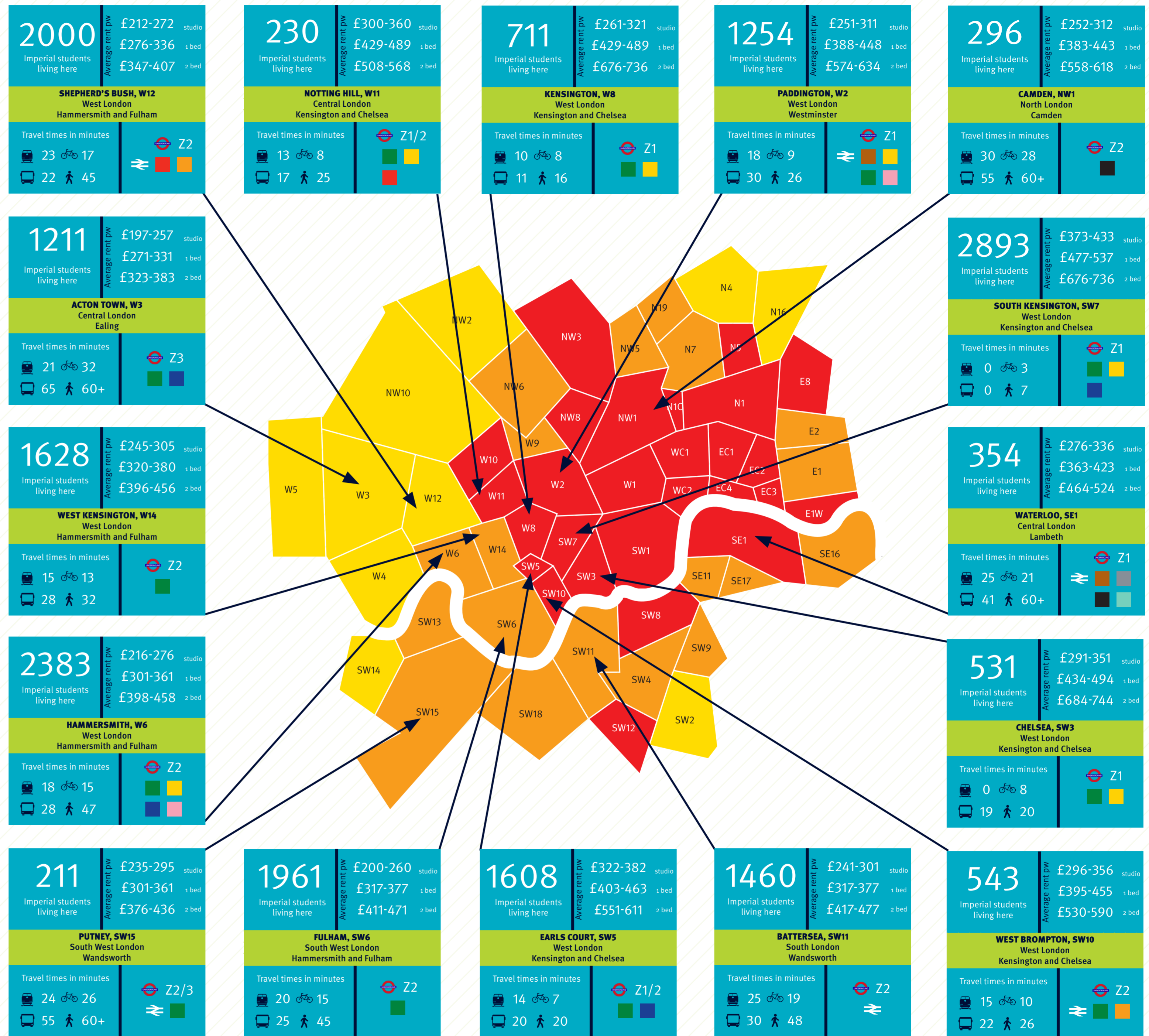
