




Overview of Imperial College Health Partners



We're focused on:

- **enabling discovery** of new ideas and innovations, and then facilitating the adoption and diffusion of these across the NHS
- reducing variation and **spreading best practice** across healthcare
- strengthening synergy between the NHS and industry for the benefit of patients and to **create wealth** for the local population, the NHS and the UK.

Our work programme



Ten projects, supporting delivery of our three strategic priorities, make up our work programme: four clinical and six cross-cutting

Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD)

- Significant cause of morbidity in community
- Significant cause of urgent and unplanned admissions & readmissions
- Evidence based intervention to improve outcomes and reduce readmissions
- Scope current position – prevalence, demands on the system, access to care
- Build on NWL CLAHRC's work into next phase of implementing practice

Cardiovascular rehabilitation

- Cost benefit evaluation of 'MyAction' programme – multidisciplinary rehabilitation for high risk patients and post acute episodes
- System piloted across Westminster
- Model for best practice in cardiovascular disease

Cancer

- Funding London Cancer Alliance
- Focus on early detection and diagnosis
- Implementation of best practice care pathways
- Patient satisfaction

Mental Health

- Current work to scope mental health morbidity and care across North West London with a focus on psychosis
- Agenda review with North West London Mental Health Programme Board
- Clinical Advisory Group to be established

Alignment and dissemination of research

- Identification of new knowledge from research for implementation
- Improved patient access to research – ‘consent to contact’ project
- Prioritise primary care and mental health. Reinvigorate Primary Care Research & Education Network
- Speed implementation of trials – single approval process

Patient Safety

- Research into clinicians’, patients’ and carers’ perceptions of priorities across primary and secondary care settings
- ‘Foundations for Safety’ and development of evidence based strategies
- Junior doctors’ induction rationalisation
- Profile Quality & Safety Committee and Hospital Board safety reporting

Supporting Whole Systems Integration (WSI)

- Programme evaluation
- Exposure to best practice
- Leadership Summit in February

Collaboration with industry

- Establish industry clinical advisory forum – nominations invited
- Research into clinical priorities for technology/commercial solutions
- Systematic process for industry to engage with NHS
- Procurement issues being addressed

Intelligent use of data

- Collaboration with North West London Commissioning Support Unit
- Creation of linked data across health and social care
- Potential for service evaluation and improved commissioning
- Potential for real-time evaluation of new interventions
- Potential for observational epidemiological research
- Potential for North West London to be national demonstrator site

Overseas development

- International market in whole system assistance in health care development
- Healthcare UK proposition being developed
