Study title: The Use of AHA's Cholesterol CarePlan to be Delivered as a Mobile Phone App to Patients Prescribed Cholesterol Lowering Medication

Imperial College London is the sponsor for this study based in the United Kingdom. We will be using information from you and/or your medical records in order to undertake this study and will act as the data controller for this study. This means that we are responsible for looking after your information and using it properly. Imperial College London will keep identifiable information about you for 10 years after the study has finished.

Your rights to access, change or move your information are limited, as we need to manage your information in specific ways in order for the research to be reliable and accurate. If you withdraw from the study, we will keep the information about you that we have already obtained. To safeguard your rights, we will use the minimum personally-identifiable information possible.

NHS will collect information from you and/or your medical records for this research study in accordance with our instructions.

NHS will use your name, NHS number and contact details to contact you about the research study, and make sure that relevant information about the study is recorded for your care, and to oversee the quality of the study. Individuals from Imperial College London and regulatory organisations may look at your medical and research records to check the accuracy of the research study. NHS will keep your NHS number and contact details confidential but will pass on a copy of your consent form containing your name to Imperial College London. The only people in Imperial College London who will have access to information that identifies you will be people who check the consent form for data monitoring purposes. The people who analyse the information will not be able to identify you and will not be able to find out your name, NHS number or contact details. NHS will keep identifiable information about you from this study for 10 years after the study has finished.

DHM, UKCloud and Vivify will enable safe electronic capture of data you provide (containing your name, date of birth, mobile number as well as questionnaire responses) via the web application. Vivify - the party responsible for streamlining patient care via the AHA Cholesterol CarePlan, will be processing the data you provide. DHM in partnership with UKCloud will be responsible for safe storage of identifiable data you provide. DHM will be responsible for transferring data without any identifiable information to Imperial College London upon study completion. Following the transfer of non-identifiable data to Imperial College London, DHM will destroy all identifiable and accompanying data collected via the web application.

When you agree to take part in a research study, the information about your health and care may be provided to researchers running other research studies in this organisation and in other organisations. These organisations may be universities, NHS organisations or companies involved in health and care research in this country or abroad. Your information will only be used by organisations and researchers to conduct research in accordance with the [UK Policy Framework for Health and Social Care Research](#).

This information will not identify you and will not be combined with other information in a way that could identify you. The information will only be used for the purpose of health and care research, and cannot be used to contact you or to affect your care. It will not be used to make decisions about future services available to you, such as insurance.
