What's the problem you are solving?


Who is affected and the numbers involved?


Why is it important to solve this problem now?


What is already known about the problem and how is it currently tackled?

Data analysis plan

Have you got the right expertise on the team for the data analysis?

Do you need clinical trials input?

Think about the development you will need to ensure its success.

Have you the write team members in place to support you and deliver on the project.

Get people who really can deliver with and for you and the project
