#### **3yr SOP Review**

The RGIT 3 yearly SOP review has started, and it is currently still in progress. As a result of the increase in queries, during this review, the review process has not been completed in full yet. The SOPs and

applicable templates that still need to be updated will be uploaded on the RGIT SOP website at the dedicated link after approval by the HoRGIT.

#### **Trial Registration**

The assessment of Imperial and Imperil NHS Trust study registry records is currently performed by the QA Facilitator. The use of the EudraCT registry has been recently restricted as a result of the new CTIS system being in place. Please note that from 31 January 2023, all new CTIMP CTAs must be submitted by using CTIS. Also, the addition of new member states (MS) in a study will only be possible after that the trial has been transitioned, that is by using the CTIS register. Local CTIMPs will be automatically registered in the ISRCTN public registry through the CWOW scheme.

#### **HRA**

The <u>Quality Standards and Design and Review Principles</u> were introduced in Sept 2023 and have become mandatory on 1 Dec 2023.

The HRA have published guidance on decentralised trial methods.

The HRA have updated the guidance for CAG Applicants.

The NIHR learn platform will bring together the learning from the HRA and the NIHR in one place and will replace the former LMS by the next March (2024). This will enable the HRA to deliver training for a broad range of professionals such as HRA staff, researchers and confidentiality advisory group members, public involvement network members and research ethics committee members. All courses will be available in the new platform, which will also provide training for all users. More information on this is available from the HRA Learning & Development Team.

### **Training Updates**

#### **TRAINING**

The college encourages the use of online resources for learning, e-learning. The creation of a shared training folder in the RGIT shared area has been also proposed. #### **RESEARCH INTEGRITY & ETHICS AT IMPERIAL COLLEGE E-LEARNING**

The RGIT reminds that the <u>'Research Integrity & Ethics at Imperial College'</u> e-learning course is mandatory for all new staff starters at Imperial, including Clinical and Clinical Research Academics, and Research Academics. This self-guided 90-minute training covers the integrity and ethics of research at the College, and it is part of the RGIT training webpage. As explained in the previous issues of this newsletter, we encourage all staff who want to refresh in research integrity to take it, as this helps to understand the role of RGIT within the college Research Approval Process and the REF (research excellence framework).
