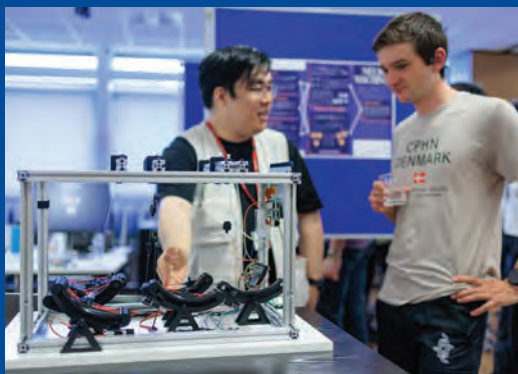

The Imperial Bursary

Could you be eligible for one of the most generous bursaries of its kind in the UK?

How much can you get?

Up to £5,000 each year towards living costs.

Who's it for?

All UK undergraduate students who meet the income criteria and who are eligible for UK government funding. You don't have to take out the loans to qualify.

How do you qualify?

You qualify automatically if your annual household income is under £70,000.

Do you have to pay it back?

No, and you'll receive it on top of any government loans you're also eligible for.

How do you get it?

There is no separate application process for the Imperial Bursary. You have to apply for a means-tested government loan like a Maintenance Loan to be considered, but you don't have to take out the government loan.
